Edna's Epistle ...

It is with great sadness that we record the demise of four much loved and respected residents of Southam.

Honor Hobbs, from The Close, died on Friday 11th October at the wonderful age of 95 years. With Honor's passing goes the history of Southam as she moved into Southam Lane as a two-year-old toddler. A full tribute to Honor will be published in the next edition of the Newsletter.


Peggy Simister, from lower Ratcliff Lawns, died on the 19th October also at the wonderful age of 95 years. She was one of the few remaining residents who had moved into a newly built Ratcliff Lawns in about 1967. Peggy's early working years were with Rolls Royce in Blackpool. Then after marrying Ray she was employed by Gloucestershire County Council and became secretary at Pate's Grammar School. Her retirement was spent helping in Charity shops and becoming an active member of Southam WI. In 2014, Peggy's health started to fail and towards the end of her life she had 24-hour care.

Bill Porter from Ratcliff Lawns died suddenly on 3rd November at the age of 93 years. A great shock to Southam residents as Bill was so well known for his regular daily walks around the village with his little black dog Pippa. His lovely smile, kind nature and support for all the activities organised in the village and beyond will be his lasting legacy. He will be sadly missed by so many people. A tribute to Bill can be found later in this edition.

Linda Ankcorn, again from Lower Ratcliff Lawns and opposite to Peggy, died on 4th November at the younger age of 74 years. Linda was born in Kings Norton, Birmingham and retired to Southam after a career in banking. While living in Birmingham Linda ran Rainbow, Guide and Ranger units and over the years clocked up many camps, tours, church parades and opportunities to volunteer at the World Centres in India and Switzerland. When Linda moved, she continued her links with the Girl Guide Organisation and was a member of the Bishops Cleeve Trefoil Guild as Chairman and enjoyed many years with her new guiding friends. Linda received her 50 years in service award to Guiding in 2014 at Westminster Abbey.

As well as Guiding Linda's other love was Southam WI. She was a quiet but most efficient and loyal member who welcomed members on the door at every meeting and played an important role on the committee for many years. She had us all knitting vests and hats for babies and collecting cotton pillow cases which were then sent to Sub- Saharan Africa. We will truly miss her.

During the creation of the Newsletter, the input from Mr Russell was merged in with the thoughts and views of another villager who was not quoted and as such the piece could have been mis-interpreted as the sole views and opinion of Mr Russell which is inaccurate as he was only referencing the use of traffic lights for excavation work in The Close. This was not the intention of the Production Team and for the mistake we sincerely apologise. It is also noted that Mr Russell and his wife have actually resided in Southam for 38.5 years and not the 35 as published in the article.



Don't get Hooked this Christmas

Identity fraud and phishing attacks increase in the run up to Christmas - make sure you are not caught by fraudsters.

Identity fraud is when your personal details are stolen and used to commit fraud. The first you may know you've been a victim of identity fraud is when you receive bills or invoices for things you

haven't ordered, or when you receive letters from debt collectors for debts that aren't yours.

Phishing is the practice of sending emails purporting to be from reputable companies in order to induce you to reveal personal information, such as passwords and credit card numbers.

To protect yourself from identify fraud and phishing:

- **Don't** throw out anything with your name, address or financial details without shredding it first.
- **Don't** click on the links or attachments in suspicious emails.
- Never respond to messages that ask for your personal or financial details
- Check your statements or online banking carefully and report anything suspicious to the bank or financial service provider concerned.
- If you're concerned about the source of a call, wait five minutes and call the company they claim to be from on a number you know is genuine. If you can, use a different telephone.
- Don't leave things like bills lying around for others to look at.

Bus Services

The Marchants contract ended on 27th October and Stagecoach will now be providing an hourly service from Winchcombe to Cheltenham (W). This is a commercial service which is not subsidised and in order to provide a service to all the communities (including Southam) previously served by Marchants, Gloucestershire County Council has negotiated a new subsidised route between Chipping Campden and Cheltenham which will be provided by Pulhams (606). This timetable is available on the Southam Today website.

Primary School Provision in Bishops Cleeve

The Chairs of Governors of local primary schools brought to the attention of parish councillors the Options Appraisal recommendation made by Gloucestershire County Council to build a new primary school on the Cleeve School site. This was debated at our September meeting and a letter was sent to the Director of Education expressing concern at this recommendation, in particular because of the potential for further pressure on the facilities and infrastructure of Bishops Cleeve. In addition, it was considered that siting a school at this location would add to traffic congestion in the area around Cleeve School and this would inevitably impact on Southam Lane and New Road. Any further information received about this proposal will be reported at future Parish Council meetings.

The date of the November meeting was changed due to councillor availability and Parish Council news for November will therefore be reported in the next newsletter.

Councillors would like to take this opportunity to wish all residents a **Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.**



Southam Drama Group have reluctantly had to move to a different venue from Southam Village Hall to perform our annual panto, to Prestbury Hall, Bouncers Lane. The village hall capacity was reduced by 40, which meant that 160 people from the village and relatives of the group, would not have been able to see the panto who came last year. This we felt was unfair for them.

In memory of Bill Porter 1926 - 2019

Born in London in 1926 Bill spent his childhood in Hinton Admiral, Lechlade and Oxford. Attending the City of Oxford School, he excelled at cricket, rugby and as a fire warden. His prowess at rugby served him well during his National Service helping him 'skive off drill to play for the regimental team'. Bill studied geography at University College, London where his proudest achievement was to win 'purple' colours for athletics competing alongside Olympic gold medallists.|

Bill followed a career as a schoolmaster, initially teaching at Plymouth College, before moving to Prince Henry's, Evesham where he spent over 30 years rising to the position of Deputy Headmaster. He was heavily involved in coaching rugby and athletics, as well as leading the annual school ski trip.

Bill loved the outdoors as an enthusiastic walker. He met Edna walking in Triglav, Yugoslavia and after their marriage they completed the Cotswold Way and the Welsh 3000. Bill moved to Southam in the late eighties, with Edna, and they quickly immersed themselves in village life. From proudly tending their own garden they quickly took on responsibility for the Village Hall gardens and became active members of the committee.

After Edna passed away Bill continued to support the village, his enthusiasm for parking cars during Race Week is legendary, along with his consumption of cake. He even took up singing at the age of 92 to join the Christmas choir. Bill walking Pippa became a daily fixture in the village - and perhaps his last concern was if there would be anyone to deliver this newsletter.




